## **Speakers**

**Andy Bannister** (Solas Centre for Public Christianity) was Director and Lead Apologist at the Canada office of Ravi Zacharias International Ministries (RZIM) prior to joining Solas in September 2016. Andy holds a PhD in Islamic studies and his latest book, *The Atheist Who Didn't Exist*, is a humorous engagement with the New Atheism. Andy is a keen hiker, mountain climber and photographer. He is married to Astrid; they have two children, Caitriona and Christopher.

**Mark Stirling** (Cornerstone Church, St Andrews) is a former medical doctor who pioneered work amongst university students with the Navigators in Edinburgh from 1998 to 2004. He has a PhD in Biblical Studies from St Andrews University. He and his wife Jenny still live in St Andrews where they work closely together in The Chalmers Institute, a learning community that resources and equips people to exercise faithful biblical leadership in the church and in society.

**David Galloway** is a gastroenterlogical surgeon, formerly President of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons Glasgow. He has worked in Zambia, Malaysia and the USA. He is a founder of the Centre for Intelligent Design, speaking regularly on issues of faith, medicine and science.

Max Baker-Hytch (Wycliffe Hall) completed a D.Phil. in Philosophy at Oxford University and held research fellowships at both Oxford and the University of Notre Dame, before joining Wycliffe Hall in 2016. Max's research interests lie at the intersection of analytic philosophy of religion and epistemology, and he has published on such topics as divine hiddenness, religious diversity and the nature of rationality and knowledge.
