 - Bill Phillips = Nobel prize in physics (a Christian)




- Atheism = This universe is all that exists mass energy is fundamental
- Theism = There is something else a God who created and upholds it all
- Where does the evidence lead? Atheism? Theism? Neither?
- Not proof (that is only in mathematics)
- From the data of the world, what's the best explanation (inference)?



- 'Proof' = Strong evidence to put a matter beyond reasonable doubt
 - Ie: Cannot prove mathematically that my wife loves me but have enough evidence that I'd stake my life on it!
- We put faith in many things without 'proof':
 - Transport?
 - Bridges?
 - Banks?





- Erroneous definition of 'faith' as 'blind faith'
- Faith is essential in science!
 - Faith in the rational intelligibility of the universe
 - Must believe that science can be done
- Faith in God is compatible with faith in science

Faith in Atheism

 Faith in atheism is not compatible with faith in science!

 - Second Law of Thermodynamics (Entropy)
 - Universe is expanding
 - Radiation afterglow from Big Bang explosion
 - Great Galaxy Seeds
 - Einstein's Theory of General Relativity

The cause must be:

- Spaceless because it created space
- <u>Timeless</u> because it created time
- Immaterial because it created matter
- Extremely powerful because it created out of nothing
- Intelligent because the creation event & universe are extremely precise
- <u>Personal</u> because it made a choice to make something out of nothing

- Personal James 4:8





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



When you say there's too much **evil** in this world you assume there's **good**.


When you assume there's **good**, you assume there's such a thing as a **moral law** on the basis of which to **differentiate** between good and evil.
