DIRECTOR'S REPORT ANDY BANNISTER

My family and I recently had the privilege of spending a three-month sabbatical in North America, revisiting places we knew from our time living in Canada and speaking in churches from the East Coast to the West.

A question I was asked again and again was "What's happening spiritually in the UK?"

Each time, I replied that while the UK can be a tough place to do ministry—with its odd mix of insipid secularism, cultural relativism, and the growth of other religions like Islam—overall, I'm tremendously encouraged.

Why? Because as the Solas team and I travel and speak across the country, in church after church we're seeing green shoots: people coming to faith, returning after years away, or openly exploring Christianity.

We've noticed this trend informally for some years, but now there's hard data to back it up. A growing body of research—most recently from the Bible Society's *Quiet Revival* report—shows that Gen Z (those born between 1997 and 2012), far from rejecting belief, are actually more open to spirituality than any generation in recent memory.

Indeed, a 10,000-person survey for OnePoll revealed that just 13% of under-25s now identify as atheist. That's half the rate of their parents: it looks as if Gen Z is now the least atheist generation in today's Britain.

What an incredible opportunity to engage a younger generation who are spiritually open, but haven't yet discovered who Jesus is—or why He's the answer to the questions they're asking. There's a "quiet revival"—just not quite revival yet—but at Solas, we're thrilled to be part of this unfolding story.

Whether it's mission weeks on university campuses, or helping churches run community outreach events; whether it's the 20,000 copies of *Have You Ever Wondered?*—our popular giveaway evangelistic book—or the almost two million engagements with our short-form videos online (with feedback showing we're reaching the

unreached), it's been wonderful to see God at work and the growing hunger for real answers. As one student remarked: "I find Jesus incredibly compelling—now I need to know if this is real."

We've also been busy teaching and training in churches up and down the country. We're passionate about equipping Christians with practical ways to have natural conversations about Jesus with colleagues, classmates, friends, and family. If there is a new spiritual openness beginning, it's vital that Christians have the confidence to "make the most of every opportunity" (Colossians 4:5).

We couldn't do this work without those who faithfully pray and give. If you're a Solas donor—thank you so much! Your partnership in this kingdom work means so much to us.

May you know the Lord's joy and presence this year; and may he open up doors for you to share the hope you have in Christ with those He brings across your path.

I hope you enjoy this Annual Report and the deeper dive it does into Solas's gospel work.

THE CALL

Many years ago, sitting in a church in Johannesburg, I remember two missionaries being invited to share some of the work they were involved in around the world, and particularly in Europe. They invited the congregation to think and pray about whether we were perhaps being called to missions work. I remember – although I didn't understand it at the time – the Holy Spirit giving me a little nudge. My reaction was akin to that of finding a worm in an apple: "Eewww". Yes, very pious! But years later I find myself in Scotland working in the mission field to bring the Good News of Jesus to people all around the country – and what a wonderful privilege it is!

Once we grasp how God loves all of us and reaches out to us with grace and forgiveness, how could we not want to go out and share that message with those around us – in whatever context the Lord has placed us?

In the past year at Solas we have had the amazing opportunity to partner with many different ministries and organisations to speak at over 50 evangelistic events across the UK.

HIGHLIGHTS

Two of my highlights come from Christian Union events weeks where I was invited to speak. I spent a week with Glasgow University CU speaking at six events – all in different venues. One evening was a pub event on the west side where we had a great turnout, with lots of guests who had been invited by CU members. After the event, I had the opportunity to speak to one student for about an hour about how Christianity makes sense of life.

The following week I was at Queen Margaret University for their CU events week where I had lots of great conversations and was able to give our *Have You Ever Wondered?* book to several students who are exploring Christianity.

Another highlight was speaking at a church outreach event in Glasgow, where I spoke on the topic of God and Science. There were many science students in the room and we had a great time of Q&A after the talk. Many of the students were from abroad, and had never heard the gospel before!

ANSWERING OBJECTIONS

Andy spoke at a convention where he was introduced to a Chinese man who was struggling to accept Christ's physical resurrection in light of his view of natural science. We sent him a copy of *Have You Ever Wondered?* and later the man's friend emailed to say "Thank you for taking the time to speak to him despite the language difference. I appreciated your attention and patience at such a busy event". We were delighted when she emailed back three weeks later to say her friend had accepted Christ.

Thank you for lifting us up in prayer as we've gone out to share the hope of Jesus across the UK.

EVANGELISM IN ACTION SALTBURN

We were delighted to hear that our Launch Pad series had inspired someone in this way, and that Adam was prepared to put the idea into action. Our team helped him to design a banner for his book stall, and he later got in touch to let us know how he'd used it at a men's breakfast at a local pub: "I set up the stall and told the 20 or so there about my vision for it. Some there had a look and took books away with them. But at the end of the morning as I was packing it away, the barman came over and said he was interested in taking a couple of books away. So he went away with a copy of *Have You Ever Wondered?* and also one of *Making Sense of Life* [by Michael Ots]."

We have heard many stories about how *Have You Ever Wondered?* has been given away to intrigued individuals—and it wasn't the first time that the bar or cafe staff at an event have been the curious ones! Adam also invited Solas to come to the Guisborough Deanery in June for a Confident Christianity training session with a number of churches in their diocese.

We hope this will lead to further work with some of the churches represented there.

CONFIDENT CHRISTIANITY

Confident Christianity remains the flagship training initiative of Solas. At its heart, the goal is not simply to provide answers, but to equip Christians to respond winsomely, persuasively, and with grace—even when they don't have all the answers. Our vision is to help believers step into conversations that open up, rather than shut down, and to speak about Jesus in ways that are confident, compassionate, and compelling.

NEW FORMATS

Over the last twelve months, Solas partnered with churches and organisations across the UK (and Guernsey) to host 13 Confident Christianity events in a variety of formats (see map). These ranged from evening engagements and half-day conferences, to full-day events and series of three or four sessions.

The latter allow churches to explore deeper engagement with evangelism across multiple sessions.

MORE OPPORTUNITIES

A new development in 2025 has been the decision to offer midweek Confident Christianity evening sessions for only the cost of travel, waiving the usual hosting fee. This approach has made events significantly more accessible—especially for smaller churches or those in areas less likely to host a conference. It has already opened doors to communities we may not have otherwise reached. The midweek offer also fits well with speaker availability, making this both a strategic and sustainable model.

We have already lined up a full calendar of events for the rest of 2025, and we're excited for what's ahead.

One particularly encouraging addition this year has been the inclusion of the book *Have You Ever Wondered?* as a free gift for new supporters at Confident Christianity events. With nearly

20,000 copies sold, this book continues to spark conversations about life, meaning, and faith—and makes a great gift for those exploring Christianity.

Although we ran slightly fewer Confident Christianity events than the previous year—due in part to Andy Bannister being on sabbatical—we have already lined up a full calendar of events for the rest of 2025, and we're excited for what's ahead.

With our three staff speakers Andy, Gavin Matthews and Steve Osmond, and the support of in-house events managers, along with trusted guest speakers like Gareth Black, Ben Thomas, Sara Stevenson and Jared Michelson, we are increasingly equipped to serve churches across the UK with high-impact, gospel-focused evangelism training.

We value our partnerships in the gospel very highly and count it as a huge privilege to serve churches of many types, along with theological institutions, student organisations, and youth ministries. Our role in these contexts is to equip Christians to share their faith more confidently, effectively, and winsomely.

EQUIPPING FOR EVERYDAY EVANGELISM

The recent <u>Finding Jesus</u> report from the Evangelical Alliance highlights the fact that, for a huge number of people who become Christians in the UK, the personal witness and life of a Christian friend was pivotal to their conversion. While clergy and other full-time Christian workers are important, equipping *every* Christian to share the gospel is a critical part of reaching the UK for Christ.

WORKING WITH OTHERS

- Churches: In places such as Kirkliston near Edinburgh, Solas speakers have helped congregations think through issues of culture and the gospel, and how we share our faith.
- Workplace Christian groups: In groups like the <u>Lloyds Bank Christian Network</u>, Solas has trained believers to make a clearer stand for Jesus amongst colleagues.
- CU and Scripture Union events: In Glasgow, Edinburgh, Dundee, <u>Southampton</u>, and York, students have been equipped to tackle their non-Christian friends' questions and objections concerning the Christian faith.
- Guest Preaching: Slots in Sunday services have seen Andy, Steve, and myself addressing congregations across the UK, on a range of topics, such as bold evangelism in Acts, forgiveness, God's love as our motivation for mission, and many more subjects.
- Mission Conferences: Evangelism

- training has been delivered for groups such as the <u>United Free Church of Scotland</u>, the CS Lewis Institute, and ShareWord Global.
- Training for Ministry: Solas has taught theological students training for ministry (e.g. at London School of Theology and Faith Mission), as well as Christian workers (e.g. Rock UK and UCCF), among many others.

SHORT ANSWERS

At Solas, we love answering the tough questions that sceptics and seekers are asking. One of the ways we do this is the *Short Answers* videos. We try to make them short, clear, sometimes funny, but always relevant. Every other week we release another, and now they are a treasure trove – a gift that keeps on giving! Hardly a week goes by when we don't hear an encouraging story about how a video helped someone with a question they were thinking through, or a question that they've had from a friend. A young lady who worked her way through them all, for example, said how crucial they were in helping her come to put her faith in Christ.

Some of my recent favourites have been: <u>Does Artificial Intelligence (AI) Disprove God?</u>,



Is Atheism Irrational?, Is Christianity Just a Scam?, and Why Are So Many Christians Such Awful People? These represent just a few of the questions we hear as we're out engaging with different audiences.

SCIENCE AND FAITH

In 2025, we also kicked off a new series of articles titled *Lab Notes from the Faithful*, where we



interview scientists from different backgrounds, working in different fields, about their scientific work as well as their Christian faith, and how the two complement each other rather than conflict. It's been such an interesting series, and we've been blessed with a variety of wonderful guests - ranging from galactic archaeologists to evolutionary geneticists working in the field of botany at some of the most respected institutions. We even interviewed a leading Professor in the field of sociology who has spent much of her research career focussing on the interaction of faith and the world of the sciences. After reading any of these articles it's clear that there really is no conflict. Rather, science - in all its many forms - makes much more sense if God exists.

Please continue to pray that these great resources would be shared by more Christians so those who are curious, sceptical or questioning will be exposed to the wonderful truth of the gospel.

As social media channels evolve, we have adapted our content to the short video formats (Reels on Facebook and Instagram, along with YouTube Shorts). The podcast is also available on multiple platforms such as Apple Podcasts, Spotify and Amazon Music.

Our goals are to intrigue new audiences with provocative questions and answers around the Christian faith. Many responses, comments, and engagements indicate a real mix of those interested in spirituality, antagonistic characters, and Christians encouraged by having their own doubts addressed.

The latter half of this year has seen Andy Bannister work on developing a TikTok channel, seeing incredible uptake of over 160,000 views in the first nine months. Across all channels, Andy's one-minute videos have had nearly **two million** views this year.



The Solas fiscal year runs to 30 June, and the figures presented here are subject to final sign-off by our trustees and accountants (Innes &

Partners of Inverness). Both income and expenditure increased over the last year, with income increasing by over £28,000 and expenditure rising by a more modest £23,000.

We have been pleased over the past two years to shift and diversify our balance of income towards individual donors (and associated gift aid) and away from reliance on grants from trusts and foundations.

Staffing costs as always are our largest expenditure category, as we seek to provide a fair employment package for our valuable team.

As always, a ministry like ours depends heavily on donations, both from individuals and groups. Most of our evangelistic work and resources must be provided free of charge for seekers and sceptics, so we rely on other Christians to provide financial backing. 2010 - GOSPEL IN THE PUBLIC SQUARE

With New Atheism riding high off the back of Richard Dawkins's *The God Delusion*, David Robertson, pastor of St Peter's Free Church in Dundee, wrote *The Dawkins Letters* in response. Solas Centre for Public Christianity was then set up by former Scottish National Party leader Gordon Wilson (Chair of the Board) and David (Director) to help Christians defend and share their faith better in the public square.

The first of many annual Solas conferences (organised by Tim Allyn, our first employee) was launched, bringing world-renowned apologists and evangelists to Dundee, such as John Lennox, Sinclair Ferguson, Os Guinness and many others. Solas tackled various issues in newspapers, online (YouTube was only 5 years old!), at universities, and in government consultations.

Solas became involved with the European Leadership Forum, offering evangelism training and resources to church leaders across Europe. Week-long residentials were held on "persuasive evangelism", an approach to sharing the gospel focusing on taking people's questions seriously and working within their cultural context.

2015 - SOLAS MAGAZINE

Solas launched a new publication to help Christians think about cultural issues. Its legacy includes Gavin Matthews, now our Assistant Director, who served as a writer and sub-editor. The following year, David recruited Andy Bannister to take over the Director's role at Solas.

We sadly lost Gordon Wilson in the summer of 2017, but he would have been delighted to know that David Robertson preached the gospel at his funeral in St Peter's Church in front of Alex Salmond, Nicola Sturgeon and John Swinney (possibly the last time they sat together!) amongst many attendees. It was a great embodiment of the vision of Solas – to be active in public life and then seize the opportunity to share the gospel.

David Robertson moved on to a new ministry opportunity in Australia in 2018, but Solas continued to grow. Andy Bannister led the ministry to focus exclusively on evangelism and evangelism training. The following year, a new conference series, Confident Christianity, was launched, as well as the Persuasive Evangelism Podcast, both of which have been mainstays of our ministry ever since.

2020 - BEYOND SCOTLAND

During the COVID lockdown, Solas took a step of faith to expand, as Gareth Black joined the team as a speaker based in Northern Ireland. The ministry's impact was now reaching far beyond its Scottish roots. Andy relocated to England to be closer to family, while Gavin took on leadership in Scotland, where he was joined on the speaking team by Steve Osmond in 2023.

2025 - A LASTING LEGACY

Solas remains committed to bringing excellent evangelism and apologetics training to churches across the UK. We support Christian Unions from Southampton to Aberdeen by speaking at their mission weeks and other outreach events in a climate that has changed significantly from the antagonistic days of Richard Dawkins. What a difference 15 years can make! We are excited by the new interest and openness to the gospel, and are ready to grow and participate in God's plans for the next 15 years.

Our vision is to see the good news of Jesus proclaimed in every corner of the UK, and for all Christians to be empowered and equipped to share their faith. The needs and challenges may be great, but we continue to seek God's will, as we strive to play our part in the great commission.

As we look to proclaim the gospel wider, deeper, and further, we have embarked on an exciting and ambitious Strategic Plan that seeks to grow the work of Solas over the next three years.

WIDER

Solas plans to grow the ministry in a number of key areas this coming year:

- 10% more evangelistic events with university Christian Unions
- 25% of Confident Christianity training events to be accompanied by evangelistic events
- Twice as many Confident Christianity events as last year
- Six new areas of England and Scotland supported with training
- Four or more events in Northern Ireland, Eire and Wales
- Over 500,000 more social media hits
- 10% more traffic to the website

SWAN SONG FOR SWAN HOUSE

Solas has been blessed with low-cost office space in Dundee for over a decade, but we are moving to pastures new! In the autumn, we're relocating from Swan House to fresh office space in the heart of Perth.

DEEPER

As well as providing more spiritual investment in the team, Solas is looking to deepen core relationships to help advance the Kingdom. These include:

- Churches: Partnering more closely to support congregations better
- Evangelists: Working with more guest speakers and writers to get the gospel out further
- Organisations: Collaborating with like-minded ministries to reach more people
